





Lenten Series 2023

A number of years ago, we were looking for a short program to introduce the Christian faith to people outside of our church. There are some pretty good programs around, like Alpha and Christianity Explored, but we were looking for something a bit more "church-oriented." So Bishop Sutton put together a five-part introduction called *Veritas*. The word veritas is the Latin word for "truth." In an age of skepticism, this program seeks to present Truth. And without giving away too much, you can probably determine who is at the center of this message (St. John 14:6).

Now you may be wondering, why are we presenting an introduction to Christianity to a group of parishioners who are already committed to the Christian faith? The answer is that we are hoping that once you go through the program, you will catch the vision, so to speak, and want to see others find the Truth. Our desire is to take the members of CHCC through Veritas so that when we offer the program again (later in the year), you will be willing to invite friends, neighbors, and co-workers, who do not know Jesus Christ, to participate.

Here is an overview of the five talks:

- March 1 The Introduction: Through the Looking Glass (Dcn. Werner Heissenhuber)
- March 8 Exactly What is Truth? (Dean Charles Camlin)
- March 15 The Cleansing Power of Truth (Fr. Michael Templin)
- March 22 The Truth Gives 20/20 Sight (Fr. Kasey Gage)
- March 29 Truth is Living (Bishop Ray Sutton)

I think that you will find these talks to be engaging and thought-provoking. I pray that the Lord will reignite us with a love for the Truth this Lent, and that He will instill in us a desire to see others come to embrace the Truth with us.

The Angel gifts were delivered to Collinwood Care Center. Thank you all for your generosity and love shared with the residents.

"Chalking the Doors" is a Christian tradition practiced throughout the world. While it is not common in the United States, you will very often find the tradition held throughout Europe by Anglicans, Roman Catholics, and Lutherans and accompanied by caroling, feasting, and general celebration, as we did this year. Chalking the Doors occurs at the beginning of Epiphany tide, traditionally on the Eve of the Epiphany also known as Twelfth Night, the last night of Christmastide.

On the door of the house, or church is written with blessed chalk: 20 + C + M + B + 23

This symbol has two meanings: 1) it represents the names of the 3 Magi who came to visit Jesus: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar; and 2) It is a blessing: *Christus Mansionem Benedicat* which in Latin means "Christ bless this house." At heart then, Chalking the Doors is a New Year's blessing asking Christ's grace and favor upon our homes as the Christian Year unfolds, and to bless all those who come under our roofs as we minister to one another, and those to whom we are sharing the gospel with through word and deed. by Brett Lemke

Our cathedral has had a few gaps in our vestment inventory. You see, it is normal for a cathedral to have matching sets of vestments for the sacred ministers, and so I offered to help fill a few of the gaps. For instance, the beautiful set of rose-purple vestments we use on Advent 3 and Lent 4 did not have a matching dalmatic, so I was able to order the fabric from the UK and sew one. Likewise, I have made a white set of vestments and hangings to match bishop's white chasuble and cope purchased from Whipple and Co in Exeter (UK), since I could purchase the same fabric and trim that they used. I already have fabric on hand to sew a green set, and I hope to have all the pieces sewn before the long green season starts in June. We will still need a second chasuble for the red and violet sets, if anyone is interested in donating for them.
